

Tragic Overture Opus 81

Brahms (1833-1897)

This magnificent concert overture was completed in 1880. Like many other nineteenth century overtures, it is a work complete in itself, and is not a prelude to something further, such as an opera. From the very first bar it is dramatic and full of contrast, and the orchestra employed in the score is quite large.

L'Arlésienne

Bizet (1838-1875)

The two "L'Arlesienne" Suites consist of Bizet's incidental music for Alphonse Daudet's play in sun-drenched Provence. At first, neither the play nor the music were successful, but Bizet extracted the first suite: Prelude, Minuetto, Adagietto, Carillon, and the second suite was strung together after he died by another French musician. This has three sections: Pastorale, Menuet and Farandole.

Mendelssohn's ninetieth opus was written in 1883 (when he was twenty-four), for the Philharmonic society of London. It has a carefree Italian character, based on his memories of the Grand Tour which he undertook a few years previously. (He was a wealthy young man). Despite the work's fluency and charm it was not an easy task, and gave Mendelssohn much anguish in its composition.

The first movement is an athletic Allegro, full of youthful optimism. The second movement was supposedly inspired by a religious procession in Naples and is called the "Pilgrim's March". The third movement is a graceful Minuet, and the fourth a fast and furious, hopping Italian dance called a Salterello.

Robert Ferguson

Robert Ferguson is the resident conductor of the Havering Concert Orchestra and lives in Emerson Park, Hornchurch. He studied at the Royal College of Music with Cyril Smith, and as a pianist has appeared in the Purcell Room, the Wigmore Hall and the Royal Festival Hall. His piano duo with Christopher Kite performs throughout the British Isles, and they have recently recorded further live performances for transmission on BBC Radio Three.
